PRESIDENT'S COLUMN:

A WHOLE LOT HAS HAPPENED SINCE OUR LAST NEWSLETTER. Inmates from Newton Correctional Facility came and worked on everything from ceilings to floors and in between. The final result is that the house is finished inside. The woodwork and staircase are beautiful. These men put their hearts and souls into their work and made the 102-year old house come alive. Garland Seibert and Bob Thomas were kept really busy working to keep the men supplied.

Ferne & Lloyd Michael and Bob Thomas kept the men motivated with daily doses of sweet rolls and doughnuts. A final pizza party was enjoyed by all.

What still needs to be done is on the outside. We would like to consider re-siding and reinsulating the house. We would also like to replace the aluminum combination windows with permanent wooden storm windows. We are hoping to hear soon that we will get some assistance from a Polk County Community Betterment grant to help with installation of outside stairs, a ramp, back door stoop and sidewalks. We would also like to make a permanent replacement for the plywood cellar door.

A committee, composed of the Board, has come together to make decisions about making the house into a museum. An outline of classification of exhibits was developed, along with a list of items that we have for display so far. Jerome Thompson, who is the State Curator for the Iowa Historical Building, came to our February meeting, toured the facilities, and gave us an overview of archival materials and procedures. He was very impressed with what has been accomplished. He also encourages us not to lose our momentum.

The Johnston Historical Society has been featured in the winter '04-'05 edition of IMPACT, a magazine that is published and distributed by Prairie Meadows Racetrack and Casino. The kitchen in the barn was built with \$2000 that was awarded to the Society by E.J.Giovannetti in the form of a Community Betterment Grant last year. The pictures of the loft, the west end of the barn, and the kitchen are really beautiful.

The Society has also received a letter from Mayor Brian Laurenzo, on behalf of the community, expressing their appreciation for the Simpson Barn Project. After the cultured limestone is finished with warmer weather, we will have a "Handing Over of the Keys" Ceremony at the barn.

We will be sending a list of names for inscription on bricks to be placed in the barn patio. We can always take more names. The patio was made so that inscribed bricks can be inserted into the patio. *Mary Jane Paez*


